Academic Goals

This will be a big year of growth as students begin to take larger responsibility for themselves and their learning!

Teacher Bio

My name is Meredith Buelken, and I go by Ms. Merry. This is my first year teaching in Egypt after receiving my Teaching Certificate from Michigan State University, Michigan, U.S.A. My Bachelor's Degree was in Elementary Education, with a focus on Language Arts—so I am very excited to be your English Language Arts teacher this year! The students will learn more about me as the year goes on, and in the meantime, here are my goals for your students this year:

Literacy is the focus, but that is not just the act of being able to read and write. It is also the ability to understand and be understood, and as fifth graders they will learn how to do this on a higher level.

- The textbook "Journeys" will be used to explore different genres of short stories, which will include; Humorous Fiction, Realistic Fiction, Historical Fiction, Legends, Fantasy, Informational Text, Biographies and Poetry.
- They will be able to respond with deep analysis through free writing, short stories, and presentations.
- They will engage in various forms of writing, such as opinion, research, persuasive, and others.
- And most importantly, we will focus on loving literacy! Read at home, read with your students, and discuss anything you are reading—every moment engaged in literacy at home will strengthen their progress in school!

Personal Goals

The focus in my class is not only on academics, but on the student as a person. In order to maximize a person's growth and success, there must be a sense of belonging and a support system of people who care about you.

- We will have weekly community meetings at the beginning of class on Sundays in order to know one another in a respectful and welcoming setting.
- Of course, there will be no tolerance for bullying whatsoever, and our behavior expectations will be clearly stated in this packet.

- Aspire to higher levels of responsibility, respect, rigor, empathy, and empowerment.

I hope you can all look forward to a fun and rigorous year of learning and growing together! I am here to help you learn, but I can't wait to learn from you all as well.

5th Grade Behavior Expectations

Our goal is to have each student understand that there are set rules that must be followed at all times. There are explicit consequences for not following rules, and fun rewards for following them. The following chart is called the Behavior Chart, and is what each student must follow. I and the other 5th grade core curriculum teachers will also use this system, so it will be consistent in every class.

Behavior Chart Rewards and Consequences

Each number in the Behavior Chart is expected behavior for our 5th grade students.

If any student does not follow these expectations, they will receive **one reminder**—this is a warning mark. Their reminders will be recorded and tracked throughout the year.

Any student who receives more than 3 reminders in a cycle (2 weeks) will lose some privileges the following cycle. Students can earn back privileges by receiving 3 or less reminders during that following cycle.

Students who receive less than 3 reminders per 2 weeks will earn privileges each cycle. Every 2 weeks the homeroom teachers will update the list of reminders on our class blog, so you and your student can monitor their behavior.

The first 2 weeks of school, no reminders will be given. As students learn the rules and procedures, they will receive direction and instructions, but it is a week of learning. After those first weeks, they will be expected to know and follow the expectations.

We will be constantly re-teaching these expectations all year. We understand that students need to learn, and we also know they are capable of being held accountable. All of the teachers will work together to make sure your student is fully able to succeed behaviorally. Homework turned in after the due date will get a zero, but must still be turned in as part of the learning process.

If a student is sick, traveling, or has other circumstances and an excused absence note is issued from the office, student will have time to make up for the work.

Late assignments and projects will be accepted, but with a deduction of points:

One Day Late	10% Deduction
Two Days Late	20% Deduction
Three Days Late	30% Deduction
More than Three Days Late	No credit, but must be turned in for knowledge and practice

All homework will be marked and returned to students to use as a reference for studying. Students are responsible for keeping their returned homework organized and available, and copies will not be given if originals are lost!

Hello parents and students! Fifth grade is a year of increased student responsibility and accountability! Your road to success starts with being prepared every day, in order to be the best student you can be! The following materials are **REQUIRED** and should be **LABELED** with the student's name

For Class Everyday:

- Pencil Case
